Baltimore, Maryland

Many of Baltimore's attractions are concentrated around the Inner Harbor, the original, rehabilitated seaport. Nearby are Federal Hill, a historic neighborhood, and Mount Vernon, the city's cultural center and home to top museums.

Saint John, New Brunswick (Bay of Fundy)

Although famous for the Reversing Rapids at the Bay of Fundy, Saint John is also home to splendid Victorian architecture, quaint shops and a vibrant arts scene. It is also a gateway to New Brunswick's scenic villages and seascapes.

Reversing Falls Rapids - Watch reversing rapids. Twice daily the Bay of Fundy tides rise faster than the river.

Trinity Anglican Church - Dating back to 1877, the original structure was destroyed by the Great Fire.

Halifax, Nova Scotia

Halifax was long defined by naval operations. The 18th-century Citadel still stands guard, but today overlooks a thriving city whose restored waterfront features historic architecture, shops, museums, bars, restaurants and more.

Historic Properties Development - Stroll along the waterfront, through cobblestone streets and long boardwalks.

Peggy's Cove - Spectacular views of the glacier-laden coastline and its impressive lighthouse.
